The National Dance Education Organization (NDEO) is sponsoring an "Action Research" workshop to be hosted at BYU!

The National Dance Education Organization (NDEO) is sponsoring an "Action Research" workshop to be hosted at BYU! NDEO has previously sponsored similar workshops at Temple University in Philadelphia as extensions of the Research in Dance Education (RDE) project. BYU has been selected to host the first of these workshops to be held outside of Philadelphia! An initial workshop is scheduled for Friday evening September 23rd and Saturday (all day) September 24th 2005. A follow-up workshop will be held Friday March 3rd 2006, as a pre-conference day preceding the 2006 UDEO conference.

One of the outcomes of the RDE project was to identify areas where dance education research is needed. One area the organization has chosen to promote and advocate, is action research, whereby teachers teaching in dance classrooms throughout the United States might help advance the profession by reflecting on, documenting, and synthesizing/analyzing data regarding student outcomes in their own classrooms.

In Utah, with our abundant resources and opportunities in dance—in the private sector, in K-12 public education, and in higher education—we have the potential to contribute significantly to the body of research in dance education. We hope you will consider attending the Action Research workshop, in order to learn how you might contribute to this worthwhile and significant cause.
